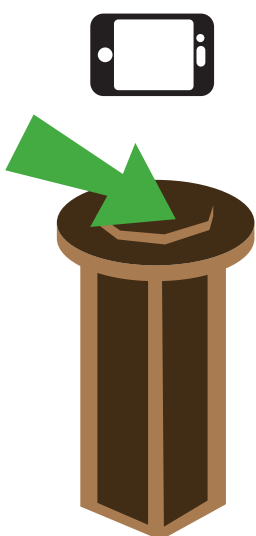


Calling all Community Scientists!

HELP US TRACK LANDSCAPE CHANGE

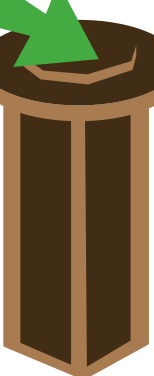
The Frank M. Ewing/Robinson Neck Preserve is home to an ecologically diverse landscape. The Preserve's marshes, waters and pine forests serve as habitat for otters, waterfowl, spawning fish and deer. However, sea-level rise is degrading this beautiful landscape. With your help, The Nature Conservancy is tracking these changes using long-term photo monitoring. We will compile the photos submitted by community scientists like you to document the long-term changes of the Preserve to inform our management efforts.

1.



Place the side of your camera phone flat on the round disc, with the back against side 1 of the octagon.

2.



Take a photo of the view, without a filter.

3.



Repeat on the other 7 sides. Take one photo pointing skyward with the bottom of the photo along the 9.
